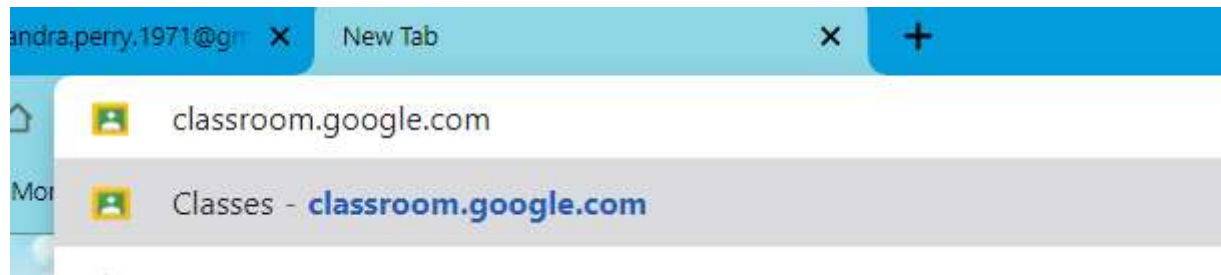


# Let's Join a Google Classroom

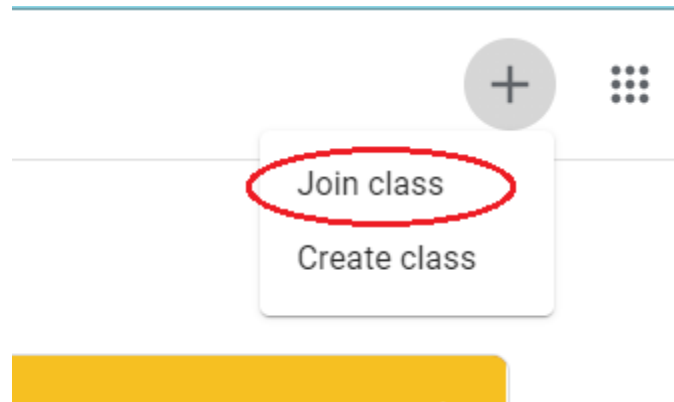
# Step One

- In your internet browser, type in [www.classroom.google.com](https://www.classroom.google.com)



# Step Two

- Click “join”


To sign in with a class code
